I) Chair's Report

The Miami River Commission unanimously adopted their December 5 public meeting minutes.

MRC Chairman Horacio Stuart Aguirre stated he and MRC Director Bibeau attended Sallye Jude's recent funeral. Sallye Jude was a wonderful volunteer Miami River Commission board member for 24 years. She served as the Chair of the Stormwater Subcommittee, which works on improving water quality. A recent news article described her as the "Queen of the Miami River". She championed historic preservation, public greenspaces, community vegetable and fruit gardens, flowering trees, reducing waste, and much, much more.

The free 24th Annual Miami Riverday will be held April 1, 2023, 1-6 PM, Lummus Park, 250 NW North River Drive, featuring free oat rides, live music, environmental education, historic reenactors, children's activities, food and drinks.

II) Informational Presentation Regarding Antillean Marine Shipping Corporation in Operation on the Miami River For Over 50 Years

MRC Managing Director stated the presenter contracted Covid, and therefore asked for a deferral.

III) Informational Presentation Regarding Future Improvement Plans for Sewell Park

Hector Badia, Assistant Director of the City of Miami Capital Improvements Department, and Chris Evans, Interim Director of the City of Miami Parks Department, presented 3 potential improvement plans for Sewell Park. The plans all featured:

- Public Riverwalk consistent with Miami 21 Section 3.11 and the Baywalk, Riverwalk Design Standards and Guidelines.
- Elevating the entire lower riverfront portion of the park to stop the dry day flooding which bubbles up through the very low ground's limerock
- Opening and improving the currently fenced off large natural mangrove portion of the park to the public, while removing the invasive plant species.
- Marine Patrol dockage and small office to be shared with Parks staffer
- All dockage will be setback 10 feet from the federal navigable channel line

Mr. Badia estimated the project will cost \$7 million, the City appreciates FIND's awarded grant cost share, and potential sources for the City's needed cost share are the City's Parks Impact Fees and the City's current Bond issue.

MRC Director Bibeau thanked the City of Miami for planning improvements to Sewell Park, and circulated a related Florida Wildlife Commission grant opportunity for the City to consider applying.

Attendees noted NW South River Drive in the area of Sewell Park has no sidewalk, therefore it is in need of the City's standard

Spencer Crowley noted the Seawall elevation is currently planned at 6', which would require a floating dock type transition or ramp like in Lummus Park. On the Miami River the City Code requires a minimum 4' elevation of new seawalls. Mr. Badia replied the City would continue working on the design of the desired limited boat dockage.

IV) Preliminary Discussion Regarding Potential Winterfest Holiday Boat Parade on the Miami River

This item was requested by MRC member Mercedes Librada Rodriguez whom is not feeling well today, and therefore asked for the discussion to be deferred.
