I) Chair's Report

The Miami River Commission unanimously adopted their January public meeting minutes.

MRC Vice Chairman Jim Murley, Chief Resilience Officer Miami-Dade County, provided the following report:

I would like to welcome Sallye Jude's family, and thank County Commissioner Eileen Higgins, the Board of County Commissioners and Mayor Levine Cava for presenting a special Resolution of Sympathy for her passing.

The free 24th Annual Miami Riverday will be held April 1, 2023, 1-6 PM, Lummus Park, 250 NW North River Drive, featuring free boat rides, live music, environmental education, historic reenactors, children's activities, food and drinks. In addition, at Riverday we will release the 20th Annual Miami River Map and Guide. The Miami River Commission thanks Commissioner Higgins for sponsoring the board of County Commissioner's adopted urging of the Florida Legislature to appropriate a \$150,000 line item to the MRC in the State's FY 23-24 budget. Before you are just the start of many support letters still coming in from Miami River condo associations, retail businesses, restaurants, developers, marinas, law firms, engineers, elected officials, etc. in support of this state funding request.

The MRC thanks the Hands on Miami volunteers whom picked up garbage along the public Riverwalk shoreline in Curtis Park on Sunday January 15.

II) Review of Brickell Bridge Traffic Study

The December 9, 2022 "Pedestrian Bridge Traffic Statement, Brickell Ave Bridge" was distributed and discussed. The signed and sealed professional traffic engineer report was paid for by "Miami Bridge", the future redevelopers of the adjacent Hyatt site. The traffic engineers observed the bridge operations with and without white glove police officers. Without Officers openings are very often extended by pedestrians dangerously walking across the bridge after the vehicular and pedestrian safety gates have closed. The extended wait times directly connects to the number of vehicles waiting for the gates to reopen. When a white glove police officer was in place and observed, they were able to stop the dangerous and illegal pedestrian crossings when the bridge was trying to open, which reduced the time of the bridge openings by around 50%, therefore significantly reducing the traffic buildup. This traffic improvement is able to be implemented quickly and is inexpensive.

Subject: DHR Miami Circle updates, January 2023

Brett, see below updates from DHR Director Lotane. Thank you for all that you and the Miami River Commission do to help us manage the Miami Circle.

On October 11, 2022, State Historic Preservation Officer Alissa Lotane (Director, Division of Historical Resources) visited the Miami Circle to meet with Brett Bibeau of the Miami River Commission. Also present were Dr. Kathryn Miyar, State Archaeologist, and one representative each from Miami Dade County and the Florida Public Archaeology Network (FPAN). The group discussed the condition of the property, including landscaping and interpretive panels that are

now in poor condition due to sun exposure. We also discussed parking, security, and potential options for a replica of the Miami Circle on top of the site.

On November 14, Director Lotane met virtually with Mr. Don Slesnick, former mayor of Coral Gables and current board member of the Division's non-profit Citizen Support Organization, Friends of Florida History, Inc., to discuss the site's management history. Mr. Slesnick put Director Lotane in touch with representatives at History Miami, the former site manager at the time the panels were printed (and currently listed on the panels as a partner). Director Lotane contacted communications staff of History Miami; they were able to search their files and found the original text and print files for the panels. These will need review and some updating of logos at the very least.

Discussion of the site and replacement of the panels is on the agenda of the next Friends of Florida History, Inc., meeting scheduled for January 26, 2:00-4:00pm. Brett and members of the Miami River Commission are welcome to attend virtually (contact <u>Carl.Bryant-Martin@dos.myflorida.com</u> for access to the webinar and agenda). We are proposing that the Friends group assist in raising funds for the new panels. Discussion will center on updating the interpretive signs including materials, copy, and funding; we will also update them on the other topics we discussed in Miami.

Additionally, while Alissa Lotane was in Miami, she learned that there are two, and perhaps even three, sources of laser scanned data for the Miami Circle, including perhaps data from Florida Public Archaeology Network, Archaeologist Bob Carr, and/or University of South Florida. Staff have not had time to track down the data, but this is positive news, as we would need the laser scan data to ever recreate any kind of representation of the Miami Circle on the site. Funding to build the replica would need to be secured in either a Legislative Budget Request or other private source for this to occur. Before a cost can be determined, research is needed into what materials will work best and last longest. Possibilities include epoxy to look like limestone with clear or colored epoxy poured into the solution holes (holes are a trip hazard), or there could be a flat concrete representation with an artist rendering of colors to show where the solution holes and artifacts were located and where a potential structure might have been. The Division has no current plans to complete the replica; this could potentially occur if funding is available in the next 3-5 years.

Security is a topic that we are open to discussing, but we are unable to pay for the full amount of security within our current budget. We would be open to a shared cost for security, at approximately 15-20% of the cost, but cannot commit at this time. We would like to have a follow up call in the next 2-3 months to discuss this and other items above.

Miami River Commission's Stormwater Subcommittee Public Virtual Workshop Minutes December 7, 2022

The Miami River Commission (MRC) Stormwater Subcommittee's quarterly virtual workshop convened at 10 AM on December 7, 2022. Attendees included Anita Nash, FDEP, Ely Estevez, City of Miami, Omar Abdelrahman and Juliet Ruggiero, DERM, Patty Harris, MRC, and Brett Bibeau, MRC Managing Director.

I. "Miami River Basin Water Quality Improvement Plan" Agency Quarterly Implementation Progress Reports – Mr. Omar Abdelrahman, Miami Dade County's Department of Environmental Resource Management's (DERM) provided a report covering July – September 2022. The most alarming water quality violation was detected at Wagner Creek testing station WC04 in July had E-coli. of 39,700 (cfu/100ml) when the safe water quality standard is only 410 (cfu/100ml).

II. Update Regarding "Vacuum Truck, Street Sweepers, and Scavenger Water Decontamination Vessel" Grant Application to FDEP

MRC Director Bibeau thanked FDEP for awarding the MRC's submitted application for \$600,000 in grant funding from the State's FY 22-23's \$20 million for improving water quality in the Biscayne Bay Aquatic Preserve, by increasing frequency of vacuum truck services in stormwater manholes along the Miami River (\$300,000), landside garbage pickups (\$165,000), street sweeper truck (\$100,000) and Scavenger Water Decontamination Vessel services (\$35,000) along the Miami River. The stormwater system was identified as a source of pollution in the County's recent helpful Miami River Water Quality Assessment, which was reviewed during the MRC Stormwater Subcommittee's June quarterly public virtual workshop.

The MRC SSC's next quarterly virtual workshop will be March 1, 2023, 10 AM.

The virtual workshop adjourned.

RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION R-156-99 REQUESTING INPUT FROM THE MIAMI RIVER COMMISSION BEFORE THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS CONSIDERS A RESOLUTION OR ORDINANCE IMPACTING THE MIAMI RIVER

BODY

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature recently established the Miami River Commission as the official coordinating clearinghouse for all public policy and projects related to the Miami River to unite all governmental agencies, businesses, and residents in the area to speak with one voice on river issues; and

WHEREAS, the Miami-Dade County Commission would benefit from the Miami River Commission's expertise when considering environmental, economic, social, recreational and aesthetic issues related to the improvement of the Miami River and surrounding areas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that the Miami-Dade County Commission shall request official input from the Miami River Commission before considering any resolution or ordinance concerning environmental, economic, social, recreational and aesthetic issues related to the Miami River and surrounding areas. The provisions of this resolution shall not apply to any quasi-judicial matter.

ORDINANCE RELATING TO ZONING IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA; AMENDING SECTION 33-284.99.59 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA; REVISING PALMER LAKE METROPOLITAN URBAN CENTER ZONING DISTRICT REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO RESIDENTIAL USES ON LOTS ADJOINING THE MIAMI RIVER IN THE RIVERSIDE SUB-DISTRICT; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, on May 7, 2013, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 13-43, establishing the Palmer Lake Metropolitan Urban Center (PLMUC) zoning district to implement Comprehensive Development Master Plan ("CDMP") policies to coordinate development intensity with proximity to transit while also maintaining and coordinating marine activity on the Miami River in this area; and

WHEREAS, on November 11, 2022, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 22-145, expanding the ability to develop affordable or workforce housing units within certain portions of the PLMUC while also ensuring consistency with CDMP policies encouraging marine activities in the relevant area; and

WHEREAS, as set forth in section 33-193.4 of the County Code, the County has long experienced a "shortage of housing affordable to individuals and families of moderate incomes, particularly those whose earnings range from 60 percent up to 140 percent of the County's median income, the 'workforce target income group[,]'" which "includes many public employees and others employed in key occupations that support the local community," and "the high cost and short supply of housing affordable to persons and families of moderate income mean that many employees in the workforce target income group cannot afford to live in Miami-Dade County"; and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County continues to experience a significant shortage of safe and stable affordable and workforce rental and homeownership units; and

WHEREAS, accordingly, this Board wishes to expand the ability to develop affordable or workforce housing units within the PLMUC to include lots adjoining the Miami River under certain circumstances; and

WHEREAS, the Miami River Commission was established by the Florida Legislature as the official coordinating clearinghouse for all public policy and projects related to the Miami River to unite all governmental agencies, businesses, and residents in the area to speak with one voice on river issues; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. R-448-99, the Board shall request official input from the Miami River Commission before considering any resolution or ordinance concerning environmental, economic, social, recreational, and aesthetic issues related to the Miami River and surrounding areas; and

WHEREAS, this Board has requested such input from the Miami River Commission regarding the provisions of this ordinance,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein and are approved.

Section 2. Section 33-284.99.59 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows:¹

Words stricken through and/or [[double bracketed]] shall be deleted. Words underscored and/or >>double arrowed<< constitute the amendment proposed. Remaining provisions are now in effect and remain unchanged.

Sec. 33-284.99.59. Uses.

No land, body of water and/or structure shall be used or permitted to be used, and no structure shall be hereafter erected, constructed, reconstructed, moved, occupied, or maintained for any purpose in Palmer Lake Metropolitan Urban Center District except for one (1) or more of the following uses. All uses are subject to the airport safety uses and height restrictions provided in Section 33-336 of this chapter. The uses delineated herein shall be permitted only in compliance with the development parameters provided in Section 33-284.99.60 of this article. Water-dependent uses delineated herein shall be subject to the permit requirements of Chapter 24 of this Code and be consistent with the Coastal Management Element of the Comprehensive Development Master Plan.

* * *

(B) Permitted uses in the Riverside Sub-District shall be as follows:

* * *

(4) The additional uses listed below shall be permitted only in conjunction with one or more of the following water-dependent uses occurring on the same lot: marinas; marine terminals, passenger, freight; boat slips for the purpose of repair; boat and yacht repair, overhaul, manufacturing; shipyards. An annual certificate of use shall be required for the water dependent use when built as part of a mixeduse development that includes one of the uses listed in paragraphs (i) through (iii) below. Development shall comply with the waterfront setback and access requirements forth Section in 33-284.99.60(B)(4)(b). The following additional uses shall be permitted only when the Director determines that such use: will not have an adverse impact on operation of the Port of the Miami River; will not substantially reduce or inhibit existing public access to marine or tidal waters; and will not interfere with the activities or operation of adjacent water-dependent uses or significantly impede access to vessel berthing or other access to the water by water-dependent uses.

* * *

- iii. On lots adjoining the Tamiami Canal, residential uses shall be permitted only above the ground story and where limited to less than 50 percent of the building gross floor area on the same lot, except that the following uses shall not be subject to the foregoing limitations on story and gross floor area:
 - a. hotels, motels, and apartment hotels;
 - b. residential developments, up to a maximum of 250 dwelling units per acre, that maintain a minimum of 12.5 percent of their units as workforce housing units on site.
- >>iv. On lots adjoining the Miami River, residential uses shall be permitted only above the ground story, up to a maximum of 250 dwelling units per acre, provided that such developments maintain a minimum of 12.5 percent of their units as workforce housing units on site.<<

* * *

Section 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected by such invalidity.

Section 4. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this ordinance, including any sunset provision, shall become and be made a part of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. The sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate word.

Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after the date of enactment unless vetoed by the Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board.


